## Alder Brook Sportsmen's Association / Long Range Rules

\*Reminder - Please check the club calendar prior to planning your trip to the range\*

- 1. Members are not permitted to go downrange at any time. No exceptions.
- 2. Honk 1-2 times as rounding the final corner to the "nest."
- 3. If there are no other vehicles and/or people near the nest, slowly proceed to and through the turnaround to verify there are no vehicles and /or people downrange.
- 4. Do not park directly under or in front of the firing line.
- 5. No more than 3 vehicles are allowed to park up top at the nest.
- 6. Follow all firearm safety rules as outlined in the section below.
- 7. In addition to Firearms safety Rules below, use common sense.
- 8. "Flagging" is never permitted in any capacity. Ever.
- 9. No firing aft of the firing line.
- 10. Members with magnum calibers are to only be engaging Magnum Designated Targets.
- 11. There are no modifications allowed to the firing line or its props.
- 12. Tables can be moved as needed.
- 13. Please always police your brass.
- 14. Please leave no trash behind.
- 15. Be safe. Be courteous. Have fun.

## **Firearms Safety Rules**

Rifles are the most destructive of all small arms. PAY ATTENTION to what you are doing at all times!

- 1. Treat all firearms as if they are loaded. Always. No exceptions.
- 2. Muzzles.
  - a. Never point your firearm at anything you are not willing to destroy and take full responsibility both legally and morally for that action.
  - b. This includes people, animals, infrastructure, vehicles, and yourselves.
  - c. "Flagging" can, and will likely, result in loss of membership.
  - d. Rifles are to be safely "grounded" or stored on racks when not in use.
- 3. Backstops.
  - a. Be absolutely sure of your target and backstop.
  - b. Be absolutely sure that there are no obstructions between your muzzle and the target.
- 4. Triggers.
  - a. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are looking at the target through your optic.
  - b. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until you are looking at the target through your optic.
